

Additional Information

The intention of the plan is to safeguard the existing unique character of this area and enable a site established 60 years ago, to meet the current and future expectations of visitors camping and staying in caravan and camper vans.

The site is an essential part of caring for Rothiemurchus Forest as it enables people to overnight and 'wild' camp in a special area for conservation beside a Natura 2000 area in a sustainable way. This facility is needed even more now than when it was originally established for this purpose in the late 1950s and early 1960s.



The woodland is very important to Rothiemurchus and the plan has been thought through to avoid the need to cut any trees.

Today's camper vans are bigger and need more space to manoeuvre, so the burnt out cottage is planned to be demolished to make this possible. Bushes and trees will be encouraged to regenerate alongside the path to help separate the overnight area from the path otherwise there should be little affect on walkers and bikers.

Should planning permission be granted the work will be phased over several years.
